SOS Special Edition Recap: 11 New Roofs, 6 Wheelchair Ramps

Teams of youthful and adult volunteers spread out over our communities June 7-Aug. 27 to be the heart and



hands of Jesus, witnessing His love while replacing roofs and building wheelchair ramps. We appreciate the service and sacrifice of so many — from supplying materials to work sites to providing food to conducting worship ser-

vices to offering overnight accommodations and more.

All of the work added up to the 2021 Servants on Site Special Edition.

The Special Edition signaled a departure from our familiar SOS, a departure required because of the pandemic, which had already forced us to cancel the 2020 SOS.

Even so, volunteers reroofed 11 houses and built six wheelchair ramps.

Roof and Ramp Recap

The Central Baptist Church team and a team of three churches in Warren County — Enterprise, Lake Gaston and Vaughan Baptist churches — reroofed three homes each. A team from Windy Gap Baptist Church In Franklin replaced two roofs; and the West Oxford Baptist Church team, a combined team from Plank United Methodist Church and Fullers Chapel Christian Church, and

8-Unit Shower Trailer Ready for Service

Work begun in May to transform a 30-foot camper (above) into an eight-unit shower trailer has been completed. Volunteers stripped the camper, framed up the inside and installed on-demand water heaters, the shower stalls and two sinks.

The shower trailer, which can be towed with a three-quarter-ton pickup, improves RHI's ability to assist in disasters where only sleeping accommodations are available to RHI volunteers and other groups.

With the completion of the trailer, RHI wants to donate to a church or other group an eight-unit shower trailer that is not mobile.

the team from Winona Park United Methodist Church of Waycross, Ga., reroofed one house each.

Central Baptist, Saint Paul's Lutheran Church and Enterprise Baptist built two ramps each.

Churches provided food for their teams. West End Baptist Church, North Henderson Baptist Church, New Sandy Creek Baptist Church and Gardners Baptist Church also provided meals. New Sandy Creek provided overnight accommodations for the Georgia team. Oxford and Mountain Creek Baptist churches provided supper meals for the Windy Gap team.

SOS Special Edition replaced the familiar summer gathering of hundreds of youths and adults in housing, meals and worship. Instead, church groups were invited to select a week to work on roof and ramp projects, select themes for their groups and plan their own worship times.

Building Wheelchair Ramps: Answers to Your Questions

Churches, do you have groups like the one pictured below who can lend a hand and help us build wheelchair ramps? Your participation would help reduce a backlog of more than 30 requests – and help us all reach our communities for Christ.

Here are answers to some questions you might



have:

What preparations are made before work begins? Before work begins, an RHI volunteer will visit the job site and assess the owner's physical and spiritual needs. The volunteer will take measurements and draw a plan. Job sites are different and custom plans are necessary.

What about materials and tools? RHI will gather the materials and deliver them to the job site and provide tools, as needed.

Are building permits required? RHI will obtain the required permits.

Who will supervise and be responsible for the work? An experienced RHI crew leader.

How long does building a ramp take? Depending on the ramp (e.g., straight ramp or ramp with a landing) and the number of crew members, it's a day to a dayand-a-half job.

Where are job sites located? In all the communities we serve, but every effort will be made to assign work in the vicinity of your church.

Can work be scheduled on Saturdays? Yes. For more information? Call 252-438-5132.
