#### Guests Enjoy Tour of Offices, Warehouse

A fleet of trucks and trailers greeted visitors April 11 as they arrived for an invitation-only tour of the Rebuilding Hope offices and warehouse.

"We called it 'Celebrating Hope,' and invited folks who, at best, have had only minimal contact with the ministry," said Rebuilding Hope coordinator Randolph Wilson.

The RHI fleet includes two box trucks, flatbed and dump trucks, as well as tool, kitchen and game trailers. Two shower trailers round out the fleet.

Before gathering for refreshments, visitors also walked through the business and planning offices and the tool, saw shop, lumber storage and refrigeration and freezer areas of the warehouse. The tour included the second floor mission quarters that are suitable for retreats and other activities that require overnight accommodations. The mission quarters includes 12 bunks, nine beds, two baths and open living areas.

"We appreciate the opportunity to tour the Rebuilding Hope facility," Henderson-Vance County Chamber of Commerce president Sandra Wilkerson said. "The board of directors and staff are in full support of your ministry and non-profit plan to serve the community.

"Your ministry is so much more than building handicap ramps, and we are here to help educate the community about your service."
