Breakfast, Devotion, Prayer: A Community of Encouragement

While most of us in the RHI community are already aware we do this every week, I consider it a worthy thing to encourage our men to participate in something that is of help to all of us. Come join us in our community of encouragement.



Some of the regular men volunteers meet at RHI every Thursday morning for a sausage biscuit (full breakfast on the first Thursday), a devotion and prayer for various needs in our community. This breakfast is hand-crafted by a couple of these volunteers to encourage the brotherhood, just as the

rest of the "meeting" does it part.

The devotion is led by one of the men, taking a turn, sharing what has been put on his heart. Observations made about God's word, how it applies to us in daily life, how it applies in our relationship to the community. This devotion includes a short time of discussion, as iron sharpens iron. We learn as men about things like 1 Tim. 3:2-5, how these attributes can positively affect us and those around us. Proverbs 27:17 shows how we can encourage each other through positive relationships.

We then spend time praying. Individual needs, community needs, ministry needs – praying for the other ministries in our communities that reach out and serve in different capacities. We pray for all the churches and pastors in our communities as they lead and care for their flocks.

While our main focus is to point people to Jesus through maintenance construction, we also understand the need to support each other and the other groups in our area that point people to Christ through their focus of ministry – food, shelter, encouragement, worship, counseling, etc. Each one of these places is important.

Building Wheelchair Ramps: Answers to Your Questions

Churches, businesses and others, do you have groups like the one pictured above who can lend a hand and help us build wheelchair ramps? Your participation would help us all reach our communities for Christ

Here are answers to some questions you might have:

What preparations are made before work be-

gins? Before work begins, an RHI volunteer will visit the job site and assess the owner's physical and spiritual needs. The volunteer will take measurements and draw a plan. Job sites are different and custom plans are necessary.

What about materials and tools? RHI will gather the materials and deliver them to the job site and provide tools, as needed.

Are building permits required? RHI will obtain the required permits.

Who will supervise and be responsible for the work? An experienced RHI crew leader.

How long does building a ramp take? Depending on the ramp (e.g., straight ramp or ramp with a landing) and the number of crew members, it's a day to a dayand-a-half job.

Where are job sites located? In all the communities we serve, but every effort will be made to assign work in the vicinity of your church.

Can work be scheduled on Saturdays? Yes.

While teams of Rebuilding Hope volunteers build wheelchair ramps and replace roofs, requests for smaller and simpler repairs can't be immediately answered. The solution is teams that can spend a few hours repairing a ramp, a stoop, stairs or a door.

The projects are perfect for a men's group or a youth group. Groups can provide a much needed service. A group need not be church-affiliated to help.

The goal is to provide two projects each month to groups in the four counties served by Rebuilding Hope, Vance, Granville, Franklin and Warren.
